

BACKGROUND

- In April 2015, consultations were held to discuss proposed streams of investment for the interest income from the 2013 Boundary Claim Trust
- Four broad streams of investment were proposed: Community Development, Economic Development, Social Development and Direct Benefits to the Debendaagziwaad



PURPOSE

• Tonight's meeting will focus on **Community Development** priorities for the east end of NFN (Duchesnay and Yellek)

- Provide updates on current and proposed capital projects
- Collect input on priorities for the east end of NFN

- Identify suitable locations (in Duchesnay and/or Yellek) for possible investments in facilities, services and infrastructure

POTENTIAL PROJECTS

Infrastructure

- Natural Gas Installations: starting end of May in Jocko Point, and also including Beaucage, Nova Beaucage/Yellek, Bineshii Light Commercial Industrial Park and Art's Lane. Minimum of 70% of homes required to sign up prior to installation.
- Road Improvements: Art's Lane has been paved and plans are to pave Serenity Lane and Yellek in the next phase. Paving has to be coordinated with the Natural Gas Project in many areas.



POTENTIAL PROJECTS

Facilities

- Community Buildings for Funeral Services: Need for facilities that members can access within NFN for funeral and wake services (as well as other private and community events).
- **Duchesnay Daycare**: New building is being planned for the near future. This consultation will help to determine the best location for this facility.
- Youth Drop-In Centre(s): Need for space to support youth programming and services. Further input on the form and function of any future facilities is needed.
