Eligibility is dependant on each graduating student submitting the required documents no later than March 1st.

FULL TIME FUNDING

Full time funding includes tuition fees, a book allowance, and a living allowance.

APPLICATIONS

The application deadline is May 15th. With this deadline, applicants will have time to gather all required documentation to submit a completed application.

Nipissing First Nation Post Secondary Assistance Applications are available online at www.nfn.ca.

Applications must be completed every year, by every student, and submitted with the requested documentation attached.

REIMBURSEMENTS OF FEES

Tuition and school residence deposit fees may be reimbursed. Reimbursement for residence depends on the fees and you allowance calculations. You are required to submit original receipts for reimbursement.

Other application fees (OCAS/ OUAC) may also be reimbursed with original receipts.

TUITION FEES

(EFFECTIVE APRIL 1, 2014)

Full Tuition fees are paid directly to any publicly funded post secondary institution. Fees which are not mandatory will not be paid (e.g. Health and Dental fees that can be opted out by the student). Research the tuition fees for your program, as you are required to submit this information with your application.

Privately funded schools will be funded to a maximum amount of \$5000. Students will need to provide proof of coverage for the additional tuition.

BOOK ALLOWANCE

All students receive a \$500 book allowance at the

beginning of each semester.

LIVING ALLOWANCE

Allowance is deposited into student bank accounts on the 1st and 15th of every month while attending school.

The living allowance calculation is based on a single student and adjusted for each eligible dependant. Single students receive \$625 twice per month while attending full-time studies. Rates for a dependant start at \$160 per month to a maximum of 4 dependants.

The living allowance is meant to help with all other costs of living - rent, utilities, heat, hydro, food, transportation - it is up to each student to budget for their needs.

Students who live in campus residence receive a single student living allowance minus the cost of residence fees.

Example of allowance breakdown for a student in campus residence: \$10,000 Single Living Allowance -5,500 Example Residence Fees \$4,500 Remainder of Living Allowance

\$4,500 Remainder of Allowance ÷16 distributions over 8 mths \$ 281.25 Amount distributed twice per month
