- Opportunities are open to spouses of registered Nipissing First Nation members and registered members of other First Nations. Please advise your status in your application.
- If no suitable candidate is found, the process will proceed to Stage Three.

#### **Closing May 13, 2022 - 3rd Round**

- Opportunities are open to all applicants (status and non-status).
- The posting will be open until filled.

The Anishinaabemwin Language and Cultural Teacher will prepare course outlines, unit plans and lesson plans according to M.O.E. curriculum and use current assessment and evaluation practices. This teacher will be the lead in the Anishinaabemwin Language and Cultural programming at Nbisiing Secondary School.

#### **What you'll do in the role**

- Organize and lead cultural activities, events and ceremonies within the school
- Collaborate with fluent speakers within the community as part of the programming
- Collaborate with the Wellness Lead, classroom teachers, the Student Success Team, students and parents in the development of culturally-based programming in the school
- Prepare lessons, evaluations, reports and exams in compliance with Ministry of Education requirements
- Provide instruction for identified and/or non-identified students in an integrated setting
- Identify, select and adapt instructional resources to meet the needs of all students in the classroom
- Attend in-school team meetings, PD days, and assist in student supervision and extracurricular activities
