

ID Requirements

What ID do I need to bring to vote?

The ID you can use depends on whether or not you are on the voters list.

If you are on the voters list, you will need only one piece of ID showing your name:

- Any document issued by the Government of Canada, the Government of Ontario, a municipality in Ontario, or a government agency
- Canadian Forces ID card
- Credit or debit card
- Outdoors Card
- Professional licence
- SIN card
- Certificate of Indian Status card
- Firearms licence
- Student card
- Union card
- Veterans Affairs health card

If your name is NOT on the voters list, you will need one piece of ID showing both your name and residential address:

- Any document issued by the Government of Canada, the Government of Ontario, a municipality in Ontario, a government agency
- Band council documentation (i.e., pay stub)
- Firearms licence
- ID issued by Inuit authority
- Letter of Confirmation of Residency from a First Nations band or reserve or an Inuit local authority
- Métis card
- Ontario driver's licence
- Ontario photo card

You can use an electronic copy of your ID when you go to vote, which may be printed or displayed on a mobile device. Photo ID is not required to vote.

ID to vote by mail

The ID you need to vote by mail is different from the ID for voting in person or for adding yourself to the voters list through eRegistration. Find examples of accepted ID to vote by mail at elections.on.ca/id-requirements.
