- If no suitable candidate is found, the process will proceed to Stage Two.

Closing June 3, 2022 - 2nd Round

- Opportunities are open to spouses of registered Nipissing First Nation members and registered members of other First Nations. Please advise your status in your application.
- If no suitable candidate is found, the process will proceed to Stage Three.

Closing June 17, 2022 - 3rd Round

- Opportunities are open to all applicants (status and non-status).
- The posting will be open until filled.

The Maintenance workers at Beaucage park will be responsible for the maintenance and upkeep of Beaucage Park. The Beaucage Park Maintenance workers will monitor the park during hours of operation.

What you'll do in the role

- Responsible to prepare the park for guests including cutting grass, disposing garbage in appropriate receptacles, and preforming general maintenance duties.
- Maintain the equipment necessary to keep the park clean, i.e. monitor the state of the lawn tractor, keep track of any items necessary to maintain the park.
- Open and close the park gate at the beginning and end of each day the park is in use.
- Monitor visitors to the park to ensure they are members and/or affiliates of Nipissing First Nation.
- Ensure a positive and professional attitude for park guests
- Other duties as required.
