The Apprentice Mechanic will preform maintenance, diagnosis and repairs on automotive, heavy equipment and stationary equipment in a safe and effective manner. The Apprentice Mechanic will provide assessments to the manager for repairs and required maintenance using independent judgement to solve work related problems and ensure quality maintenance standards are met under the supervision of the Lead Mechanic.

What you'll do in the role

- Perform work on vehicles such as breakdowns, malfunctions, and emergency roadside repair.
- Perform required inspections and preventative maintenance on vehicles and equipment to maximize the safety, productivity, and life of the unit.
- Maintain vehicle records and repair data.
- Report vehicle/equipment job status/problems to Public Works Manager.
- Use diagnostic equipment to evaluate mechanical problems in all fleet vehicles and equipment.
- Enter maintenance and repair data in Computer Diagnostics.
- Logically determine the most efficient and cost-effective repair to minimize down time and impact on the department budget.
- Conduct research and analyze computer-generated reports to assist in scheduling maintenance, developing statistical data, and providing formal equipment evaluations.
