Medical Transportation Driver's are an important service to the members of NFN. The Medical Transportation Driver is responsible for providing transportation services to and from medical appointments for client and their approved medical escorts. As appointments vary, Medical Transportation Drivers are required to meet a flexible schedule including days, evenings, weekends, split shifts, and statutory holidays according to the needs of the clients.

What you'll do in the role

- Maintain contact with Health Services for scheduling, changes and other communication needs.
- Based on schedule provided, contact clients by work cell phone to arrange a mutually agreed upon pick up time and location
- Complete and submit reports including weekly confirmation of appointment log, and incident reports, as required
- Complete and document a vehicle circle check at the start and end of each shift
- Ensure the safety kits are stocked and on board the medical transportation vehicle
- Schedule and attend to regular vehicle maintenance and servicing (i.e., tire changes, oil changes) and cleaning as required
- Complete and submit administrative reports such as leave forms in a timely manner
- Provide orientation and training to new Medical Transportation Drivers as required and directed

- If no suitable candidate is found, the process will proceed to Stage Two.

Closing October 7, 2022 - 2nd Round

- Opportunities are open to spouses and children of registered Nipissing First Nation members and registered members of other First Nations. Please advise your status in your application.
- If no suitable candidate is found, the process will proceed to Stage Three.

Closing October 14, 2022 - 3rd Round

- Opportunities are open to all applicants (status and non-status).
- The posting will be open until filled.
