

Seasonal Closure of Commercial Fishery

The commercial fishery closed for the 2022 season effective October 31, 2022 at 9:00 a.m.

The closure will remain in effect until the end of the spring 2023 moratorium.

Members who plan to fish for subsistence must follow our Fisheries Law and are asked to notify our Fisheries Office by calling (705) 753-6991.

Miigwech to registered commercial fishers who respect the will of the community and follow our Fisheries Law and processes.

Anyone selling fish harvested under the pretense of subsistence or ceremonial fishing will be considered to be in violation of NFN's fishing laws and will be subject to enforcement measures under our Fisheries Law.

Notice to Membership – Land Code Vote

The Lands, Natural Resources, Economic Development, and Environment Department are preparing to hold the required vote to approve the amendments to the Land Code that was presented to the membership at the community consultation meetings held on reserve July 19 and 25 and off-reserve August 16 and 17, 2022. Part of the process is a required vote and the current land code set the threshold of 33% of the membership must register to vote. We are commissioning One Feather to conduct the on-line voting process to replace mail in ballots and we will also have an in person voting poll in the community. Complete information packages on the Land Code amendments along with details of the vote date will be sent out in the near future.

In order to meet the required threshold set out in the current land code, we are setting up a table at the Annual General Meeting of the Membership on November 19, 2022 to assist membership to register in order to vote online with One Feather.

We will also have information on the First Nation Drinking Water Claim, Wills, Power of Attorneys, and proposed future zoning maps. And we will have ballots for a prize draw.

The construction of the expansion to the existing Water Treatment Plant in Garden Village is underway. These upgrades, which include drilling additional wells, will improve water quality, fire protection, and long-term water quantity.

Cecchetto & Sons Construction, the contractor for this project, have shared photos of the progress including backfilling, drilling and blasting, crack injection, and Blueskin and Styrofoam install.



ACCEPTING APPLICATIONS NIPISSING DEBENDAAGZIWAAD TRUSTEE OFF-RESERVE SEAT 2013 BOUNDARY CLAIM TRUST

DATE OF TERM - JANUARY 1, 2023 TO DECEMBER 31, 2025

Nipissing Debendaagziwaad who meet the following conditions are eligible to apply for the <u>off-reserve seat</u> on the Board of Trustees for the Nipissing First Nation 2013 Boundary Claim Trust:

- Be a member who has attained at least the age of eighteen years as of the date of his or her appointment as a Nipissing Trustee;
- Completed high school or the equivalency of a GED;
- Is not a member of Council as of the date of his or her appointment, as a Nipissing Trustee;
- Up to the time of applying for the position of Nipissing Trustee have not been declared to be mentally incompetent by a court of competent jurisdiction in Canada or elsewhere;
- Not have been convicted of an offence under the Criminal Code of Canada that is an indictable
 offence or a dual offence which the Crown elected to proceed by way of indictment in the five-year
 period immediately prior to applying for the position of Nipissing Trustee;
- Not have been declared bankrupt pursuant to provisions of the Bankruptcy Act in the five-year period immediately prior to applying for the position of Nipissing Trustee;
- Not have been convicted of an offence under such laws relating to the possession, possession for the purpose of trafficking, or trafficking of a prohibited drug in the five-year period immediately prior to applying for the position of a Nipissing Trustee; and
- The individual must agree in writing to become a party to, and be bound by, the terms of the Trust Agreement and to faithfully and to the best of his or her abilities to carry out the duties of Nipissing Trustee by signing a Nipissing Undertaking of a Trustee's Certificate.

Interested Nipissing members shall provide the following information:

- 1. A current detailed resume
- 2. A personal statement/letter declaring that you are not in undischarged bankruptcy or insolvency
- 3. A current Certified Criminal Records Check

As required under the Nipissing Trust Agreement the selection of the Nipissing Trustee for this vacant seat shall be a Nipissing Member who resides Off-Reserve. The appointment will be for a three (3) year term effective January 1, 2022 to December 31, 2024.



Flu Shots

Flu shots are now available! The flu shot is your best defence against the flu and is recommended for almost everyone who is 6 months of age and older.

COVID Vaccines

Health Canada has approved COVID-19 bivalent vaccines for booster doses, which target both the original COVID-19 virus and the most recently circulating COVID-19 variants. Individuals can receive the bivalent booster at the recommended interval of at least six months or 182 days from their previous dose, regardless of how many boosters they have already received.

The Lawrence Commanda Health Centre will be offering bivalent COVID-19 boosters to the most vulnerable populations, including:

- Individuals aged 70 and older
- First Nation, Inuit and Métis individuals or non-Indigenous household members aged 18 and older
- Residents of a long-term care home, retirement home, or Elder Care Lodge or individuals living in other congregate settings that provide assisted-living and health services
- Moderately to severely immunocompromised individuals aged 12 years and older
- Pregnant individuals aged 18 years and older
- Health care workers aged 18 years and older
- *NEW* Children aged 12 to 17 (starting October 17, 2022)


Children's COVID-19 vaccines for ages 5-11 years are also available.

Overview

The Anishinabek Nation is exploring current and cumulative impacts that major projects may have on our members' cultural rights and values. In the past, our spiritual relationships with the land haven't been considered in project planning or reflected in benefits received by First Nations through agreements with industry players. This initiative will produce the tools necessary for First Nations to valuate their values — to put a monetary value on the deep-rooted cultural activities that connect us to the land, to ensure decision makers are informed throughout the process and communities receive the greatest possible outcomes.

The knowledge we gather from community-based members and case studies from projects across the Anishinabek territory will lead to a summary report, which will guide the development of the cultural rights and values toolkit.

- · Hunting, trapping, and fishing
- Gathering of plants and medicines
- Camps and important sites
- Intergenerational knowledge transfer
- Cultural identity
- Sense of place
- · The right to revive cultural practices and sustain them into the future
- The right to access, use, protect and conserve special cultural/spiritual locations
- · Stories, songs related to place, both present and historical
