Miigwech to everyone who joined us to hear updates from our leadership and department directors/managers on objectives and actions around the seven goal areas that guide our work through our governance strategic plan.

The Strategic Plan is based on priorities identified by our Debendaagziwaad and is updated every year to reflect our accomplishments and to prioritize new goals and objectives for the upcoming year.

The annual community meeting highlighted the progress we've made in collaboration with, and for the benefit of, our Debendaagziwaad since our strategic plan was first implemented.

Mnogin Greenhouse

We are pleased to announce that our containerized greenhouse complex arrived at our Jocko Point site on November 9th. This vertical farming complex was purchased from an Ottawa-based company named The Growcer and consists of three containerized growing units (farms) and a packing unit (for washing and packaging produce).

The four units were placed onto a concrete pier foundation using a crane, with First



North Enterprise overseeing the installation and providing traffic control while the transport trucks were unloaded.

This is an exciting milestone and brings us one step closer to becoming operational, but there is still much to do before we can start growing.

With the buildings now on-site, we are working with Hydro One

on a timeline to complete the service connection. Plumbing beneath the units began shortly after the units arrived, with work being completed by Poly-B Plumbing. We have engaged Canadian Shield Consultants for our water and wastewater solutions, which will consist of a dug well and concrete cistern for the water source and a concrete holding tank for the wastewater from the farms and future office trailer for staff.

On the staffing front, we are pleased to welcome, Makenzie Jones, as the Mnogin Greenhouse Manager and Head Grower.

Once all servicing requirements are in place and we can determine a timeline for the commissioning and start-up of the first unit, we will be adding a System Operator to the team to start learning the ropes and assisting with daily operations. We have a pool of 1st round candidates from the initial job posting and look forward to resuming the recruitment Rob Couchie, Foreman and Lead Operator with First process.

Staff will undergo extensive training both online and in-person to become comfortable with the equipment, software, and operating procedures to ensure we deliver the highestquality products to our community and customers.

Once all services are in place, the Growcer's Farm Support & Training Team will provide 2 days of on-site commissioning full interior and

mechanical testing (plumbing, electrical, automations, lighting and HVAC). They will also provide hands-on operational training, and review best practices, troubleshooting and Growcer's farm management software to ensure automations are programmed and the software is customized for our operation. Our staff will have ongoing access to Growcer's online learning curriculum that covers hydroponic growing and plant health, as well as a suite of guick reference manuals and

operational training library that provides step-by-step instructions on how to operate our system effectively.

We plan to commission and start-up one farm initially and run it until we are operating efficiently and confident in commissioning the other two farms. Our first harvests will likely be given to the community and as samples to potential customers. Once we are operating at full capacity with the three farms, *Mnogin Greenhouse* will produce up to 15,000kg of fresh produce annually.

What we grow will largely depend on feedback from the community and customers, but we plan to start with popular lettuces such as romaine and butter crunch that have a 6-week cycle from seeding to harvest, and we will grow up to 5 varieties of lettuces and 3 types of herbs.

Mnogin means "Grow Well" in Nbisiing Nishnaabemwin and that is what we will realize with this initiative. We will grow high-quality produce at competitive pricing for our members and provide continual access to healthy food year-round.

Developing the capacity to grow our own fresh produce year-round will also create employment and training opportunities for community members and generate revenue to support operations and potential future expansion.

We gratefully acknowledge the financial contributions received from FedNor, NOHFC and Waubetek that provided the support needed to make this vision a reality that will provide real benefits to NFN.


Bineshii Business Park Expansion

We are nearly ready to move forward with the expansion of the Bineshii Business Park, which will see 26 new commercial and light industrial lots created north of Osprey Miikan near Yellek. NFN has secured \$3 million in funding from Indigenous Services Canada, and \$1 million each from FedNor and NOHFC, to support the Bineshii Business Park expansion project.

With its prime location on highway 17 near North Bay, the Bineshii Business Park is an ideal site for businesses to grow and expand. We are excited about the economic development and capacity building opportunities this project presents for our nation, our businesses, and our citizens through the creation of new jobs in various sectors. Our general contractor is required to utilize as much local NFN content as possible for construction jobs, equipment rentals and the

provision of materials and services to ensure maximum benefits and returns to NFN citizens and businesses.


The construction tender closed on October 31, 2022 and three bids were received. А Bid Evaluation Committee was formed to ensure a objective, fair, and transparent review of the tenders and achieve the best value for Nipissing First Nation through the development of this community infrastructure.

Nipissing First Nation Land Code Amendments

November 18, 2022 – Nipissing First Nation ratified our existing Land Code on May 9, 2003. A lot has changed in the past 19 years, and it is time we update our Land Code. NFN Land Code has been reviewed by our Lands Committee and legal counsel. These and any other amendments to the Land Code will require a vote which is proposed to take place on February 25, 2023.

The current land code sets the threshold of 33% of the eligible voters must be registered to vote. To make it easier for members to vote, we are offering three methods of voting:

- Online with One Feather
- By mail in ballot
- In person at one of the polls on the proposed date of February 25, 2023

Complete information packages on the Land Code amendments along with details of the vote will be sent out in January 2023. Help with online registration will be available at the Lands Office booth at the Annual General Meeting on November 19, 2022. For those who attend the Land Office booth on November 19th and register to vote, we will have a draw for a **\$150 gift card** at the end of the meeting.

All who register to vote between November 19, 2022, to January 13, 2023 are eligible for a draw for a first prize of **\$1000.00** prepaid credit card, second prize of **\$500.00** prepaid credit card, and **2 draws for a \$250.00** prepaid credit card. *(If you win your name does not go back in for the draw for other prizes)*

We are holding information sessions for the proposed amendments on Tuesday, December 20th in Duchesnay Village and on Thursday, December 22nd in Garden Village both session will be held from 6 p.m. to 8 p.m. The same material will be presented at both. It will also be posted in the Membership Portal.
