
### Debendaagziwaad / Citizenship Law Consultations Update (Con't)

NFN is creating a Debendaagziwaad Naaknigewin (Citizenship Law) to define who belongs to NFN, and their rights and responsibilities.

### Why does NFN need a Debendaagziwaad Naaknigewin?

#### **Ensure our continued existence**

Under Section 6 of the Indian Act, fewer Status Indians will be born in Canada. A Debendaagziwaad Naaknigewin ensures our continued existence and that the Indian Act does not dictate who Nbisiing Nishnaabeg are.



Establishing a Debendaagziwaad Naaknigewin is a critical governance initiative for Nipissing Nation to develop future laws

Identify who are responsible for building and honouring our Nation, who are entitled to protection within our Nation, and who are entrusted with the future of the Nation.




