Mnogin Greenhouse Updates

Our Mnogin Greenhouse team is excited to announce that we are preparing to commission and start-up our containerized growing units (farms). Our supplier (The Growcer) is sending their Farm Support & Training team to NFN the week of May 29 to commission our first two farms. We plan to commission our third farm the week of June 5 and will be seeding various cultivars on June 7.

The commissioning process involves full interior mechanical testing (plumbing, electrical, automations, lighting, and HVAC). The Growcer team will also provide hands-on operational training and review best practices, troubleshooting, and our farm management software to ensure automations are programmed and the software is customized for our operation.

Our staff have completed extensive online training and have been meeting weekly with Growcer's Farm Success Manager since the fall. We will have ongoing access to

Growcer's online learning curriculum that covers hydroponic growing and plant health, as well as a suite of quick reference manuals and operational training library.

Mnogin Greenhouse Updates (con't)

In anticipation of the greenhouse start-up, we welcomed Brody Goulais to our team on May 8 in the role of Systems Operator. We also plan to hire a summer student to work as a Cultivation and Packaging Assistant. This position not only creates an opportunity for youth to learn about hydroponic and vertical farming technologies but may also foster educational and entrepreneurial interests in the agriculture and food production sectors.

How Does it Work?

The Mnogin Greenhouse uses a deep-water culture hydroponic system where the plants float on styrofoam rafts and the roots grow into a bath of



specifically calculated nutrient solution. In this solution, the plants receive all the nutrients and water they require to grow to their full potential at a rate of 40% to 50% faster than soil farming.

We are also using vertical farming technologies by stacking rows of plants one on top of the other to grow more crops in a smaller footprint. Our greenhouse is a sustainable operation that uses 90% less water and 95% less land while yielding more crops on a yearly basis than traditional farming practices.

The containerized growing units can grow highly nutritious food year-round in temperatures ranging from -40°C to 40°C due to their structurally insulated panels and powerful HVAC capabilities.

The greenhouse also uses new technology called controlled environment agriculture (CEA). CEA allows growers to monitor and control every aspect of the growing environment such as relative humidity, temperature, air circulation, and the temperature, pH and electrical conductivity of the nutrient solution. The ability to control these aspects allows growers to provide the





plants with the optimal growing environment, which results in the highest quality of lettuces, leafy greens, and herbs.

What Will We Grow?

During the initial start-up phase, we will seed a large variety of cultivars to gain experience with as many types of lettuces, leafy greens, and herbs as possible. For lettuces, we will grow Monte Carlo Romaine, Butter Crunch, Wild Fire mix, Green Star, Five Star and Winwin Choi. For leafy greens, we will grow two types of Spinach and Kale, as well as Arugula and Watercress. For herbs, we will grow Basil, Cilantro and Mint.

Our first harvests are expected before the end of July, and samples will be distributed to community members as well as to potential customers we have been meeting with in the restaurant industry. Once we have completed one or two trial harvest cycles to learn the technology and agricultural practices, we will move towards commercial operations.

The Mnogin Greenhouse will be the largest producer of fresh lettuce, leafy greens, and herbs in the region, with the capacity to meet demand from individual and wholesale customers year-round. With 6,048 planting sites and 3 seeding areas each with a capacity of 1,600 seedlings, the Mnogin Greenhouse can produce up to 78,000 heads of lettuce per year.

Why is this Important?

The Mnogin Greenhouse will provide fresh, highly nutritious produce year-round to community members through various channels including Diners' Clubs, Good Food Boxes, Special Events, Markets and direct sales to community members and programs. This steady access to fresh, healthy food will help support wellness and food security initiatives within NFN.

It will also enhance our capacity, create social and economic benefits, and diversify the economy while creating opportunities for new business spin-offs in the food production sector.

We gratefully acknowledge the financial contributions received from FedNor, NOHFC and Waubetek to support this initiative. Watch for more updates as the Mnogin Greenhouse gets up and growing! We will be launching our website and social media sites once we transition to retail operations.



The greenhouse site was bustling with activity through April and early May with final site preparations being completed by our general contractor, electrician, well driller and plumber. A critical milestone was achieved when our well was drilled and hydro was connected allowing us to move forward with commissioning the units at the end of May.

The new Tim Hortons will offer a full menu and a spacious seating area decorated with indigenous-themed elements, including two totem poles.

Lorie Young took the opportunity to express her gratitude to the Nipissing First Nation Band Office and Chief and Council for their unwavering support throughout the project's development. "So many at Nipissing First Nation Band Office played such a big part in this, Any time I needed help, I reached out, and they were right there to help me along."

Vehicle Charging Station Subsidy

In 2022, the Economic Development department collaborated with the <u>Independent Electricity System Operator (IESO)</u> to establish a Level 2 Charging Subsidy Program. The program aims to boost the technological infrastructure of NFN in response tot he present-day environmental challenges and prepare for the upcoming shift from internal combustion engines to electric vehicle technology.

The first phase of the initiative extended a complete subsidy to NFN members over 18 years old who own a home within NFN for a Level 2 electric vehicle charging station at their residence. The home installations were completed in May 2023 by TwoWiredGuys Ltd.. A few subsidies are still available! The second phase of the initiative involves the installation of four commercial charging stations at several NFN Administration buildings: 36 Semo Road (NFN Band Office), 70 Semo Road (Education Department / Nipissing Ojibway Daycare), and 469 Couchie Memorial Drive (Nbisiing Secondary School). This work is expected to be complete in June 2023.

Includes all CLEANED plastic with recycling symbol #1 to #7: soft drink bottles, milk jugs, detergent bottles, FLATTENED milk/juice cartons.

MFTAL

Includes aluminum cans, pie baking pans, tin cans, steel food containers, EMPTY aerosol cans, and lids. Metal beverage cans, baking tins, foil and food containers.



All items must be CLEAN OF FOOD.

GLASS

Bottles and jars - lids must be REMOVED and separated, and the item must be CLEANED of all food liquid waste before being placed inside the container bin.
