Elder's Lodge Assisted Living Project Receives Funding

Great news! Nipissing First Nation is thrilled to announce that we have successfully secured funding for 10 assisted living units, amounting to an impressive \$5,762,058.25. This crucial milestone ensures that the project will proceed as planned, benefiting our community tremendously.

The overall project encompasses twenty units, with ten located in Duchesnay, at the site of the old daycare centre. Additionally, the other 10 units will be thoughtfully attached to the existing seniors units in Garden Village, enhancing the convenience and accessibility for our cherished seniors.

Although we were granted funding for half of the units, we are committed to constructing the full 20 units through a combination of NFN's own source revenues and seeking limited debt financing. This determination ensures that our vision for these assisted living units will be fully realized.


The bids received for the construction of both buildings came in lower than expected, partly attributed to the decline in material costs post the COVID-19 pandemic.

Animal Controls Calls

NFN has a new Animal Control Officer who monitors domestic animal controls issues (dogs and cats) that may be loose or cause public nuisance.

The Animal Control Officer also helps create awareness of the **<u>Nipissing First Nation Animal Control By-Law</u>**. This bylaw ensures the safety of domestic animals and our community members.

The Animal Control Officer also conducts staggered patrols in all NFN communities to monitor for compliance. In some cases, domestic animals may be picked up by the Animal Control Officer and possibly delivered to the Humane Society if the owner isn't known or can't be contacted.






