

NOTICE OF VOTE

APRIL 6, 2024

TO ALL NIPISSING FIRST NATION REGISTERED MEMBERS

TAKE NOTICE that a vote concerning the Robinson Huron Treaty Settlement Agreement for Past Compensation for the Crown's failure to fulfil its annuity augmentation promise ("settlement agreement") will be held in accordance with the terms of the Nipissing First Nation Community Vote Procedures on **April 6, 2024**.

Pursuant to the settlement agreement, Nipissing First Nation will be receiving a portion of the settlement proceeds for payment of the financial guarantees that Nipissing First Nation used to financially support the litigation plus interest on those funds. The *remaining funds* will be allocated between an amount retained for a Nipissing First Nation collective fund and an amount retained for individual per capita distributions.

You will be asked to choose which percentage of Nipissing First Nation's *remaining funds* should be distributed to the individual and which percentage should be allocated to the collective fund.

The following question will be asked of the eligible voters of Nipissing First Nation by ballot:

“What percentage of the Robinson Huron Trust Past Annuity funds should be allocated to the individual and what percentage of the Robinson Huron Trust Past Annuity funds should be allocated to the community fund?”

65% for individuals and 35% for the collective fund

75% for individuals and 25% for the collective fund

You may vote in three ways: **1) Internet / Electronic Voting; 2) In-Person Poll; 3) Mail in Ballot Upon Request for a Voting Package**

Internet / Electronic Voting - any eligible voter may cast their ballot electronically beginning **March 6, 2024 at 9:00 a.m. and concluding April 6, 2024 at 8:00 p.m.** To vote electronically please visit the link below and click the red button to get started. You will require your status number, date of birth and personal email address - please read and follow all instructions provided.

The Mail in Ballot must be received by April 6, 2024 at 8:00 p.m.

Animal Control Notice

Reminder that owners of domestic animals (cats and dogs) cannot allow their animals to run at large in any community of Nipissing First Nation. As per NFN's Animal Control By-Law, the following applies:

- No person (owner) shall allow any animal to run at large. Running at large is defined as an animal found in any place other than the premises of the owner of the animal and not under the immediate, continuous, and effective control of any person.
- An animal must be held on a leash by a person capable of restraining the animals movements or on a leash which is securely affixed to some permanent structure from which the animal cannot escape.

The NFN Animal Control By-Law is important as it keeps our community members and domestic animals safe. If you wish to report an animal control issue please contact our Animal Control Officer, Owen Boudreau, at 705-471-6844.

- The Lands Department needs to be notified of any burials on NFN lands.
- No burials will take place between November 15 and May 1.

The Funeral Burial Assistance Fund and Internment Policy is established to assist debendaagziwaad with funderal and burial costs and provide a guide to family members when making funeral arrangements.


2024 Graduates Spotlight
