About the Role

Reporting to the *Mnogin Greenhouse Manager/Head Grower* and working closely with the *Systems Operator*, the *Systems Operator Intern* will assist with the daily operations of the modular hydroponic greenhouse systems. The *Systems Operator Intern* will be part of a dedicated team that prides itself on growing the highest quality lettuces, leafy greens, and herbs for our community and customers.

Candidates do not need experience in a hydroponic or commercial farm. This role offers on-the-job and formal training opportunities to build your skills and learn the ropes of hydroponic food production. We are looking for candidates who are driven, hard-working and willing to learn. Having a green thumb and a passion for food are a welcome bonus!

What you'll do in the role

- Participate in training, including training on hydroponic technology, food safety and general worker safety.
- Implement what you have learned in your training in your daily work.
- Complete regular operating tasks in the three containerized growing units (farms), including seeding, transplanting and regular cleaning and maintenance, as instructed.
- Monitor and maintain overall health of the systems, including the seedling areas, runways, planting trays, cloud software system and general maintenance.
- Follow standard operating procedures and the provided training, including use of proper Personal Protective Equipment (PPE) and abiding by all safety measures and food safety protocols.
- Harvest, clean and package fresh produce of various types for individual and bulk orders.
- Aid in deliveries and/or sales of produce as needed, including for example, providing weekly orders to our customers and delivering bulk orders to local restaurants.
- Maintain appropriate records and ensure compliance with all applicable laws and regulations.
- As you become more familiar with the technology, you may be asked to aid in identifying or troubleshooting issues that may arise, including those of a mechanical or horticultural nature.
- Ability to occasionally work outside of normal hours of operation may be required for community events and to accommodate deliveries to customers.

What you bring to the table

- Respect for Indigenous culture and willingness to learn Ojibwe.

- Self-starter, capable of working independently and completing tasks without direct supervision.
- Ability to follow instructions and show strong attention to detail to minimize errors.
- Good reading, writing, and math skills (for calculating and recording harvest yields, inputting data into software to manage inventory).
- Comfortable using technology such as Google and Microsoft Office suites, as well as iPads/Windows computers would be considered an asset.
- Must be able to lift boxes up to 25 lbs, or 50 lbs with assistance, climb small step ladders, and work full shifts on your feet.
- A valid driver's licence is required as this position will assist with delivering orders to customers in the local area.
- Must be at least 18 years of age and be legally entitled to work in Canada.
- Preference will be given to youth who are recent graduates, are new entrants to the work force, are transitioning to a new career, or the unemployed or underemployed who are entering a new field.

- Certificate or degree in agriculture, horticulture, or related field.
- Understanding of technology and/or agriculture industry.
- Experience with growing vegetables or other plants (even at home!)

- Opportunities are open to all applicants (status and non-status).
- The posting will be open until filled.
