What you'll do in the role

- Deliver the program or course of study designated by the principal upon timetabling the school.
- The teacher is responsible for creating, maintaining, and delivering unit and lesson plans for the course of study assigned.
- Responsible for obtaining and organizing all entrusted school materials, equipment and resources relating to the course of study.
- Ensure that students have a safe, welcoming, and structured environment to learn in during the school day.
- Responsible for all assessments and evaluations from diagnostic to cumulative.
- Must adhere to a culturally authentic practice and ensure that the Ontario curriculum is used to teach all expectations.
- Maintain student marks and reporting practices to parents using school-approved methods.
- Effectively and cooperatively communicate classroom issues to the main office.
- Be available to have meetings with staff, students, and parents when requested.
- Effectively adhere to reporting deadlines.
- Assist in developing or auditing policies and procedural practices with the school and educational team.
- Adhere to and follow all policies set forth by school, the education department and approved by Chief and Council that affect their day-to-day work.
- Follow the direction of the principal.

- If no suitable candidate is found, the process will proceed to Stage Three

Closing August 26, 2024 - 3rd Round

- Opportunities are open to all applicants (status and non-status)
- The posting will be open until filled.
