- Develop an integrated culture and language plan for the Table Talk Program.
- Design, develop, and facilitate immersive land-based Language workshops and camps.
- Create written language resources and teaching tools, ensuring all necessary supplies and materials are available and prepared.
- Collaborate with staff and volunteers to nurture understanding and promotion of Indigenous language and culture through the Table Talk Program.
- Plan and implement positive social experiences and opportunities to facilitate an understanding of various Indigenous languages, cultures, and value systems.
- Act as a resource to share Indigenous Language, cultural knowledge, practices, and protocols.
- Support the production of instructional tools for the Table Talk program and collaborate with the Cultural Department as needed to produce tools for community, website, and social media.
- Prepare and maintain regular reports, analyses, and statistics as required.
- Participate in the ongoing development and implementation of policies, procedures, and best practices supportive of the rich Indigenous culture within Nipissing First Nation.
