This summer, Derica Lafrance received the news of a lifetime when she learned that she had landed her first leading role in the film *Blood Lines*, directed by Gail Maurice.

In the film, Derica plays Chani, an alluring woman who enters the life of Leonore, the estranged mother of a headstrong Métis storyteller and grocery store clerk named Beatrice. Production in northern Ontario wrapped in the late summer, and filming locations included Nipissing First Nation.

Director Gail Maurice is best known for her work in the TV series *Cardinal*, *Barkskins*, and *Trickster*.

Know the Signs

A drug poisoning is a medical emergency. Know the signs of a drug poisoning and call 9-1-1 right away:

- difficulty walking, talking, or staying awake
- blue lips or nails
- very small pupils
- cold and clammy skin
- dizziness and confusion
- extreme drowsiness
- choking, gurgling or snoring sounds
- slow, weak, or no breathing
- inability to wake up, even when shaken or shouted at

Don't Run. Call 9-1-1.

Anishinabek Police Service frontline officers, and other first responders carry naloxone and we want to assist. The Good Samaritan Drug Overdose Act provides broad legal protections for anyone seeking emergency support during a drug poisoning, including the person experiencing the poisoning.

This means citizens, including youth, will not be charged for offences such as simple possession for calling 9-1-1 in an emergency.



Carry Naloxone

Naloxone can temporarily reverse an opioid poisoning. It is available free-of-charge.

NFN Chief and Council mandated the closure of the commercial fishery for the 2024 season effective October 15, 2024. The closure will remain in effect until the end of the spring 2025 moratorium.



This closure is in alignment NFN's commitment to sustainability and the protection of

All band member family units living on NFN who have an annual family income considered “low income” (as verified against the [2024 Low Income Cut-Off Chart](#)) are encouraged to apply for the Santa Fund benefit no later than **Friday, November 22, 2023 at 4:30 p.m.**

In your letter of request, please include the following information:

- Parent or legal guardian name(s)
- Child(ren)’s name, age, and gender
- Address and phone number
- Proof of low income (OW, ODSP, income tax)
- You will be required to pick up the Santa Fund gift card at the OW reception desk or Duchesnay Hall in-person. Dates and times will be provided to the approved applicants.

***Please note that age 17 and under, must be living with applicant parent.
Special circumstances can be reviewed.***

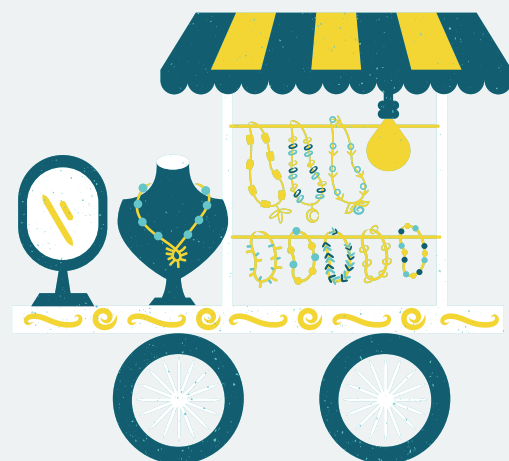
