Duchesnay Elders' Lodge Officially Opens, **Strengthening Community Care**

Nipissing First Nation (NFN) has officially opened a new Elders' Lodge in Duchesnay, named Enjinaakdawendmindwaa, providing much-needed assisted living units that allow NFN Elders to remain in their home community, surrounded by culture, family, and familiar spaces.

The new facility is part of a larger project that includes 10 assisted living units in Garden Village and 10 in Duchesnay. These units offer supportive living with 24/7 staffing, meal services, cleaning, and the possibility of person care through Home and Community Care staff.

More than 70 people attended the grand opening on June 30, enjoying tours led by the Home and Community Care team, a light lunch, and sweet treats from Ever Cool Ice Cream. Elders and community members gathered to celebrate, filling the new space with conversation, laughter, and shared pride.

The project responds directly to community feedback and identified housing gaps. In 2023, NFN secured \$6.85 million in funding from the Canadian Mortgage and Housing Corporation's (CMHC) Rapid Housing Initiative to support the projects in Garden Village and Duchesnay.

"This project has been decades in the making," says Yvette Bellefeuille, Councillor for NFN. "The vision has evolved over the years, but the goal has always been the same – to keep our Elders close to home, in a space that



Quentin "Que Rock" Commanda, a celebrated multidisciplinary artist and proud member of Nipissing First Nation, is returning to his home community with a powerful mission: to share the artistic wisdom he has gained throughout his career with the youth of his Nation.

Quentin "Que Rock" Commanda, a celebrated multidisciplinary artist and proud member of Nipissing First Nation, is returning to his home community with a powerful mission: to share the artistic wisdom he has gained throughout his career with the youth of his Nation.

As an Anishinaabe graffiti artist, Commanda's work has evolved from quick pieces to large-scale street projects and canvas paintings. Rooted in Anishinaabe teachings and methods, he focuses on creating smooth transitions of color, blending abstract forms with realism and expressionism. "I call my style 'making the woodlands dance," says Commanda. His goal is to share the teachings of his ancestors by incorporating sacred geometry into his work, creating a visual healing experience for viewers.

Through a new mentorship program, Commanda will guide NFN youth in painting a mural from start to finish, while teaching them about professional art practices,

including industry standards, materials, jargon and etiquette.

DON'T RUN. CALL 9-1-1.

Every drug poisoning is a medical emergency.

Even if you've taken drugs or have some on you, the *Good Samaritan Drug Overdose Act* can protect you. This means those who seek emergency assistance during a drug overdose, including youth, will not be charged for offences such as simple possession.

APS officers and other first responders carry naloxone; we just want to assist.

Carry naloxone.

Naloxone is a safe, lifesaving medication that can temporarily reverse an opioid poisoning. Naloxone will not harm someone who does not have opioids in their system. When in doubt, use it.



Site Visit to Solstice Gold's Strathy Project Near Temagami

On April 17, 2025 Curtis Avery, Environment Manager, and Zack Lafleur, Economic Development Manager, joined technical staff from Temagami First Nation for a joint site visit to Solstice Gold's Strathy Project at the historic Leckie Mine site near Temagami. The visit marked an important step in Nipissing First Nation's ongoing engagement with Solstice Gold, which has been consulting with NFN since late 2024.

The Strathy Gold Project aims to responsibly redevelop the former Leckie Mine site with a focus on environmental protection and meaningful Indigenous partnership. Discussions are currently underway to finalize a Memorandum of Understanding that will provide Nipissing First Nation with own-source revenue, job creation, training opportunities, and environmental oversight to ensure that development is carried out in a way that respects the land and surrounding ecosystems.

Learn about the Proposed Wind Energy Project

More Chances to Share your Thoughts During Pow Wow Weekend

Nipissing First Nation (NFN) is working with Innergex Renewable Energy to explore a wind energy project (using wind to create electricity). Two community engagement sessions were held in Garden Village and Duchesnay in June to share information and gather member input.

The project is part of a bigger plan by Ontario's electricity system operator, called the Independent Electricity System Operator (IESO), to bring in more clean energy (energy from natural sources like wind and sun that doesn't create pollution). The program is called the LT2 RFP (Long-Term Request for Proposals – a way the government asks companies to offer new energy projects).

Through our Gidaabik partnership with Innergex (a company that runs 91 clean energy sites across the world), NFN is in a strong position to be part of this opportunity.

What the Wind Project Could Look Like:

- 25 to 30 wind turbines placed about 20 km from NFN's boundary
- 150 megawatts of electricity (enough to power about 60,000 homes a year)
- Construction jobs for up to 150 workers
- 10 permanent jobs for wind turbine technicians
- Revenue for NFN, and contracts for memberowned and NFN-owned businesses

We first partnered with Innergex in 2014, but the work paused in 2018 when the Province stopped wind projects. Now that wind projects are back on the table, we are moving forward again.

What Happened at the Info Sessions:

Instead of a long speech, we set up information stations so members could move at their own pace, ask questions, and give feedback directly to NFN staff and Innergex.

Thank you to everyone who came out to learn and share their thoughts.

Next Chance to Learn More:

Innergex will be back during NFN's Pow Wow weekend – August 30 to September 1. Come out, ask questions, and have your voice heard.

New Non-Permanent Structure Law Now in Effect

Nipissing First Nation has enacted a Non-Permanent Structure Law to regulate the use of trailers, tents, sheds, and similar structures used as temporary shelters on NFN lands.

A permit is required if a structure is used for more than 14 consecutive days in a calendar year, including for structures already in place before the law took effect. Use between November 30 and May 1 is prohibited unless specifically permitted. Non-permanent structures are not allowed on vacant land, and must comply with waste disposal,

safety, and zoning regulations. Permits must be visibly displayed, and violations may result in fines

up to \$5,000.

Missed It? Here's What Happened at the **Cancer Screening Info Session**

On Thursday, July 17, the Community Wellness – Recreation & Education team at the Lawrence Commanda Health Centre hosted a cancer screening info session in Garden Village with the North East Regional Cancer Program.

The session focused on Indigenous health and the four free cancer screening programs (breast, lung, cervical and colorectal).

These screenings are free for those who qualify and help catch cancer early, when it's easier to treat.

Guests were able to ask questions, learn about culturally safe care, and see how screening fits into a holistic (whole-person) approach to health and wellness.

The event also featured a short animated video series, "Conversations About Cancer for **Indigenous People**," with Dr. Erin Peltier, a First Nations family doctor. She shares how cancer screening can honour culture, identity, and traditional teachings.

Aunties' Circle

The Right Path's Adult Mental Health Therapist started Aunties Circles, a safe space for community members to connect through care and culture.

The circles honour Aunties as nurturers and knowledge-keepers, creating a supportive group of women who uplift each other and the community.

Rooted in traditional teachings, participants bring beadwork, sewing, or journals to inspire talks. New members are welcome. The group also supports young women without female role models by sharing lessons on womanhood, motherhood, and community.

Blastomycosis: What You Need to Know

What is it?

Blastomycosis is a lung infection caused by breathing in spores from a soil fungus called Blastomyces. It does not spread between people or from dogs to humans. Symptoms can take up to three months to appear.

Where is it found?

It's found across Ontario, especially in the north, in moist soil near water. Spores are released when soil, leaves, or wood are disturbed.

Watch for symptoms:

- Ongoing cough
- Fever or night sweats • Trouble breathing
- Chest pain
- Weight loss
- Extreme tiredness

What to do:

If you have any of these symptoms — even for a while — see a health care provider and mention Blastomycosis. Blastomycosis is serious, but treatable. Mild cases can be treated at home. Severe cases may need hospital care. Some people have no symptoms and recover on their own.




