This role is responsible for preparing healthy meals and maintaining clean, safe program spaces to support various community services and events. The successful candidate will work collaboratively with program staff to support culturally appropriate gatherings, workshops, and services by providing quality food preparation and facility upkeep.

- Prepare and serve nutritious meals and snacks in accordance with program schedules and dietary needs.
- Ensure the cleanliness and sanitation of kitchen, dining, and program areas before, during, and after events.
- Follow safe food handling procedures, maintain cleanliness of food preparation and storage areas.
- Maintain inventory of kitchen supplies; report ordering needs to supervisor.
- Set up and clean program areas including tables, chairs, washrooms, and high-traffic surfaces.
- Safely operate cleaning equipment and handle cleaning supplies according to health and safety guidelines.
- Support staff during programs and events with general assistance as required.
- Promote a warm and welcoming environment for community members and guests.
- Respect and integrate Anishinaabe culture, language, and traditions into daily tasks and interactions.

Round 3 - Closing October 24, 2025,

Open to all applicants (status and non-status). Posting will remain open until the position is filled.
