Nipissing First Nation is seeking a compassionate, dependable, and community-focused individual with lived experience related to mental health, substance use, trauma, or homelessness. You must demonstrate empathy, professionalism, and a strong understanding of harm reduction and cultural safety.

W What You'll Do in the Role

- Street Outreach for wellness checks and meet with participants to assist with intake assessments and safety plans across Nipissing District
- Connect with people in the community or at their encampments experiencing homelessness, mental health or substance use and offer support.
- Pick up food packages from the Gathering Place and drop them off to participants.
- Hand out PPE and other harm reduction supplies such as flashlights, clothing items, testing strips and naloxone kits.
- Hand out snack packs and water
- Initiate, establish and maintain relationships with participants while developing trust and rapport, sharing and discussing common experiences and help build a collective sense of community for participants, supporting them to create meaningful lives in the community.
- Assist individuals one on one with navigating access to government programs and systems e.g.: (Ontario Works, ODSP, child welfare, community housing, etc.)



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- Act as a coach and mentor to help participants set goals and develop skills.
- · Plan, organize and facilitate activities and workshops.
- Make referrals to local and culturally appropriate agencies, programs and services to meet immediate needs e.g. (housing, access to elders, mental health support etc.)
- Ensure individuals privacy by only sharing information for which informed consent has been obtained.
- Communicate and work collaboratively with participants, team members, coworkers, members of the community and attend team and community meetings as required.

- Experience working within an anti-oppression framework, ensuring equity and inclusion in service provision.
- Familiarity with First Nations wellness approaches and the ability to incorporate Indigenous teachings and practices into client support is an asset.
- Experience in facilitating workshops and seminars, with the ability to engage diverse groups.
- Strong networking skills and experience collaborating with community service agencies and businesses.
- Ability to effectively interpret verbal and non-verbal communication to assess client needs.
- Excellent communication and interpersonal skills, with the ability to build trust and rapport with clients.
- Strong problem-solving, analytical, and research skills.
- Effective conflict resolution and crisis intervention abilities.
- Ability to work with diverse populations and support individuals facing barriers to employment and well-being.
- Ability to work outdoors in all weather conditions, including walking/hiking a minimum of 5km unassisted while carrying necessary supplies.
