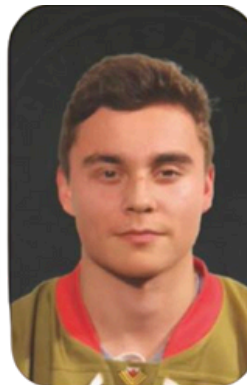
The night begins at 4 p.m. with a meet-and-greet and facility tour, giving families an opportunity to meet players and see behind the scenes. Those who can't

Update from Gimaa Cathy Stevens: December 2025

As we close out the year, I want to share some highlights and important discussions from December and the past few months. I attended several regional and national meetings, including an Indigenous Services Canada (ISC) regional meeting on October 23, the Chiefs of Ontario Fall Assembly, and RHT Litigation Fund meeting in Sudbury, the ISC Joint Gathering, and the Assembly of First Nations meeting in December.

Closer to home, I met with MPP Vic Fedeli to discuss **long-term care** and the need to better support our Elders. I also attended the Lake Nipissing Steering Committee, where **fish harvesting** was discussed. I am pleased to share that NFN fishers remain within safe harvest targets and that harvesting levels are stable.

I continue to engage in discussions on new and changing legislation that affects our Nation. This includes **Bill S-2**, which looks to amend long-standing inequities in registration entitlements for First Nations individuals and families. These changes may affect how members are recognized and how resources are accessed, so we are watching this closely. At a meeting on **new Bands and Band amalgamations**, I raised concerns about ongoing issues involving Métis Nation of Ontario and “Antoine First Nation”. Because of these unresolved issues, NFN does not support the resolution that was brought forward.

Water remains a serious concern for First Nations. Chiefs continue to push Canada to do better. The class action settlement on **drinking water** was only a minimum amount and does not reflect the true cost of fixing long-term drinking water problems. These conditions would never be accepted off reserve. The Auditor General recently confirmed that progress has been too slow, funding is insufficient, and short-term advisories often become long-term. We continue to call on Canada to reaffirm its commitment to addressing this chronic issue.

Jordan’s Principle remains challenging. There is still no clear timeline to address the backlog of applications, and this directly affects children and families. Chiefs are raising concerns about how public advocacy and legal actions are impacting services on the ground. While this work continues, families waiting for Jordan’s Principle support are encouraged to access other services so children are not left without help.

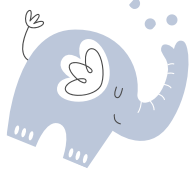
At the ISC Joint Gathering, we discussed the new federal budget. **Indigenous funding** saw a 2% cut, equal to about \$80 million. Core programs and services will remain, and water funding continues. A new Fiscal Relationship Grant is coming that supports self-determination, reduces reporting, includes inflation increases, and allows Nations to request more funding if current amounts are not enough. NFN is well-positioned for this, as we already have a Financial Administration Law and strong governance practices.

Harvesting was another key focus. Topics included moose management, inter-Treaty harvesting, enforcement, and concerns about Shipman letters. Chiefs also discussed glyphosate spraying and the need for better wildlife data.

I also want to share some positive moments. The **Seniors Christmas Party** was a great success, with good food, music, and time together. Council gathered for a Christmas dinner as well, and I attended the **Annual Business Operations update**. I am proud of the strength and growth of NFN’s business portfolio.

Proposed Solar Project on NFN Corporate Lands

Thursday, January 15, 2026

Zoom Engagement Session

What We Heard – Community Feedback on the Proposed Solar Project

At the recent community engagement session, NFN members shared important questions, concerns, and perspectives about the proposed solar project on NFN corporate lands. Below is a summary of key themes raised.

Protecting the Land, Water, and Wildlife

Community members emphasized that the land has value even when it is not developed. Concerns were raised about potential impacts to wildlife, including moose, deer, bear, migratory birds, plants, and natural habitats.

NFN confirmed that no decision has been made on whether the site is environmentally appropriate. Only early screening has occurred so far. A full environmental review would be required before any project could proceed and would include detailed, multi-season studies of wildlife and vegetation. NFN has committed to meeting or exceeding provincial environmental standards.

Cultural Knowledge and Traditional Use

Members stressed the importance of respecting cultural knowledge, Elder teachings, hunting areas, and traditional gathering of plants and medicines. It was also acknowledged that some members chose not to participate in earlier mapping exercises due to concerns about how information might be used.

NFN shared that it has access to historical records, Use and Occupancy Studies, and oral histories, and that cultural knowledge will inform any further review. Additional opportunities for Elders, hunters, and community members to provide input will be part of the process.

NFN-Led Decision Making

Questions were raised about whether NFN relies only on provincial approvals. NFN confirmed that beyond any required permits, the Nation itself must be satisfied before a project moves forward. Community values, environmental protection, and cultural considerations will guide decision-making.

Taxes, Land Status, and Municipal Role

Members asked about taxation and the role of the Municipality of West Nipissing. It was clarified that West Nipissing cannot tax NFN revenues or control decisions on NFN lands. Any municipal property taxes related to a solar facility would be the responsibility of the project proponent, not NFN. These lands are also part of a longstanding land claim and are expected to return to reserve status in the future.

What Happens Next

We thank community members for sharing your perspectives. Feedback from this session will help guide next steps. No final decisions have been made, and further community engagement will continue before any determination is reached.

Adult Recreation Reimbursement

NFN Members aged 18 and older are eligible to apply for a one-time recreation reimbursement of up to \$200.

This reimbursement is offered for a limited time only and applies only to recreation fees paid between April 1, 2025 and March 31, 2026. This is not an annual or ongoing program.

Program Overview

This fund supports NFN adult members with reimbursement for eligible recreation registration fees that promote physical activity and healthy living.

- **Maximum Reimbursement:** Up to \$200 per NFN adult member (one-time only)
- **Eligibility:** NFN members 18 years and older.
- **Receipts Required:** Original or clear copies must be submitted with the application,
- **Submission:** Drop off at the Lawrence Commanda Health Centre (58 Semo Road, Garden Village ON P2B 3K2), or email: recreimbursements@nfn.ca

Eligible Expenses (Registration Fees Only)

Recreation registration fees related to sports and physical activity, including but not limited to:

- Gym memberships or passes
- Fitness or exercise classes (e.g., spin, yoga, dance)
- Organized sports (e.g., hockey, basketball)
- Recreation programs that promote physical activity

Ineligible Expenses (Not Covered)

- Clothing or footwear
- Sports or recreation equipment
- Late fees, penalties, or interest charges

NFN Medical Health Fund Can Help Pay for Medical Costs Not Covered Elsewhere

The Medical Health Fund was established to help NFN members and their families with out-of-pocket medical expenses. The fund reimburses eligible health-related costs not covered by Non-Insured Health Benefits (NIHB), Employee or Group Insurance, OHIP, or other federal or provincial programs.

Each NFN member is eligible to access up to \$1,000 per fiscal year (April 1–March 31). For expenses incurred during the 2025–2026 fiscal year, reimbursement requests must be submitted by **April 15, 2026**.

How it works:

NFN members first access all available coverage, such as NIHB, group or employee insurance, and provincial plans. If a balance remains after these plans are used, the member may apply to the Medical Health Fund for reimbursement of the remaining amount. *If group insurance is available, it must be accessed first, and a copy of the insurance claim must be included with the Medical Health Fund application.*

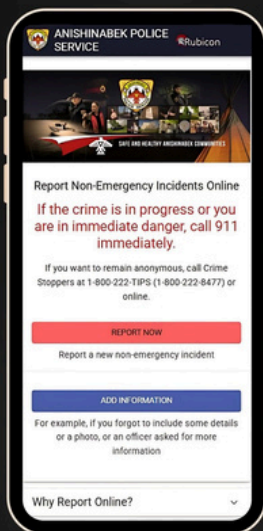
